DOCUMENTS YOU MUST HAVE

<p>1 Form I-485 Application to Adjust status An original, completed, signed application to Adjust Status. Each applicant K-1 and K-2 submits separate forms (but can be sent in the same packet). Be sure you're using the latest edition.</p>	<p>2 Marriage Certificate Showing that the US petitioner and beneficiary married within 90 days of entry within the US.</p>
<p>3 Passport style photographs size: 2 inch by 2 inch, 2 for each applicant, more if you include the I-765 or I-131.</p>	<p>4 Government Issued ID Generally your passport biographic page for each applicant.</p>
<p>5 Birth Certificate(s) Birth certificate or acceptable secondary evidence.</p>	<p>6 Proof of Admission/Inspection by CBP Generally the I-94 printout. Also include a copy of the K-1 or K-2 visa stamp + entry stamp from passport.</p>
<p>7 I-797 approval notice Immigrant Category proof - your approval letter (I-797) for the I-129F petition.</p>	<p>8 I-864 Affidavit of Support A completed, original, signed affidavit with supporting documents (including: Tax returns or IRS Transcript, employment letters, etc. as necessary). Remember each applicant must be supported.</p>
<p>9 Form I-944, Not required Discontinued form I-944 Declaration of Self-Sufficiency.</p>	<p>10 Certified criminal history documents Certified police / criminal documentation (if any) for K-1 or K-2 visa entrants. Notice this doesn't mean you're getting a new Police Clearance certificate. This is only if you have criminal history.</p>
<p>11 Filing Fees Filing fees - USCIS payment for all applicants for the form + biometrics. Filing fees are age-dependent, so be sure you pay the correct amount using an accepted method such as: personal check (recommended), money order, or credit card (G-1450).</p>	<p>12 Proof of bona fide marriage Not necessary, but highly recommended to include proof that you've maintained a bona fide marriage (albeit a short time from K visa entry, marriage, and submission of the I-485. You have another opportunity to submit evidence at the Green Card interview). Proof include photos, children born together, shared accounts, medical coverage, joint property, etc.</p>
<p>13 Translations Translations - for non-English documents, provide a certified translation from a competent person.</p>	<p>14 G-325A - not required G-325A - not required</p>

Form I-765, Application for Employment 1 Authorization	Form I-131, Application for Travel 2 Document
[OPTIONAL, highly recommended]- if you want a temporary EAD/AP card. This card allows you to work temporarily while your GC adjudicates	[OPTIONAL, highly recommended] - if you want advance parole to be able to travel abroad while your Green card is pending adjudication

Documents you may need

Form I-693, Medical Exam and 1 Vaccination	2 I-601, waiver for inadmissibility
If you need to get a new exam if overseas exam is already expired or get vaccinations (if not done already for K visa)	Or other waivers. Examples include: Waiver request for medical inadmissibility (religious, etc.)
G-1450, Authorization for Credit card 3 Transaction	
If paying the fee with a credit card
